Background

In accordance with the Community Participation Guidelines and NRP Policy on modifying neighborhood action plans, NCR routinely approves modifications to approved neighborhood action plans. NCR also works closely with the City's Development Finance Division (DFD) to implement neighborhood programs through development of new contracts or amendments to existing contracts.

Contracts and Contract Amendments:

In 2016, NCR and DFD added more than \$6 million to new or existing NRP and CPP contracts through 176 contract actions for all 70 neighborhoods:
